Essays, stories and memorial notes should be 500 to 600 words. Longer essays may be submitted at the editor's discretion. Video should be 2-3 minutes in length and may be filmed using a smartphone: find a quiet place, select a neutral background, use landscape mode, and save in a high-definition format. Send it, unedited, to the editor.

Submission of materials will be deemed to imply permission to publish. The editor and advisory committee reserve the right to ascertain copyright permissions and to refuse publication of any material not appropriate for the purposes of the O'Gara Collection.
